Grading:

- 30% Daily Participation, Practice. Actively engaged in playing during class. Practicing outside of class at least 30 minutes per week at home or school. Submitting weekly practice logs.
- 30% Music Skills and Standards. Short playing quizzes, Guitarist Profiles, guitar app reviews, songs by ear, choice pop songs
- 30% Written Quizzes. Short assessments of guitar knowledge and theory, including standard notation, tablature, chord diagrams, chord progressions, and music symbols.
- 10% Final Exam Playing Tests. Assigned pieces played as solos or small groups.

Practicing:

Beginning Guitar students are expected to practice outside of class for one 30-minute session each week. This can occur at school during a study hall, Pride Time, before or after school; or at home on their own instrument. School guitars must remain in the music area at all times. Practice logs are due each Friday via Google Form on the website.

Instrument Care:

Guitars and accessories must remain in the PHS music area at all times. Students may only use their assigned equipment during class and practice times. Students are expected to take great care of all equipment throughout the assigned semester. A parent-signed equipment usage form must be on file within the first week of class.

Guitar Open Lab:

Mrs. Armstrong is available to assist guitar students during 8th hour on Grey Days, the opposite day our class meets. This is a great time to come down and practice or to seek extra help. Playing quizzes may be scheduled during this time.
